

Citizen-driven vigilance to stop illegal fishing!

Beginning in 2017, ROC patrol boats worked with CONAPESCA (the federal fisheries authority) leading to the confiscation of 13 illegal fishing boats.

Since April of this year, no boats have been caught illegally fishing at Espiritu Santo National Park, and fish populations have dramatically increased, especially the heavily targeted parrotfish.


For 75 days, staff from ROC and CONANP patrolled the protected
